



Conference Tracks:

1. *Agribusiness*
This track focuses on research dealing with the economic sectors involved in agricultural production, such as the production, distribution, and storage of agricultural commodities, as well as the manufacture and sale of farm machinery and supplies.
2. *Technology and Innovation*
This track focuses on research dealing with new or enhanced products or processes that have technological properties that differ greatly from those of earlier versions.
3. *Food Waste, Safety and Security, and Marketing*
This track focuses on research dealing with strategies and policies to reduce food waste, enhance food security and safety (e.g., hygiene and moral/spiritual/religious compliance), and increase market access.
4. *Gender, Health, and Nutrition*
This track focuses on research seeking to comprehend the links between gender, health, and nutrition as well as how to reduce all forms of malnutrition through programs and policies to enhance diets and health.
5. *Sustainable Family Business Practices*
This track focuses on research examining how family businesses create suitable and successful governance by establishing a precise procedure to resolve family, business, and ownership/succession issues.
6. *Green Hospitality and Tourism*
This track focuses on tourism-related research that addresses the needs of travelers, the industry, the environment, and host communities while fully accounting for the economic, social, and environmental implications of tourism both now and in the future.
7. *Circular Economy*
This track focuses on research into a production and consumption paradigm that incorporates sharing, leasing, reusing, repairing, refurbishing, and recycling existing resources and products for as long as feasible while minimizing waste.
8. *Post-COVID 19 Community Resilience*
This track focuses on the long-term capacity of communities to respond to, withstand, and recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.
9. *Climate Change*
This track focuses on research dealing with methods for assisting business practitioners and farmers in mitigating greenhouse gas emissions, increasing crop yields, and responding to climate change.
10. *General Management*
This track invites research in management disciplines such as finance, accounting, marketing, human resources, dealing with family businesses, and their practices.
